Coastal Moonah Woodland

Coastal Moonah Woodland (left) is a plant community of the Ecological Vegetation Class **Coastal Alkaline Scrub**.

It is found on parts of the Point Nepean region and is protected under Victoria's *Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act 1988*, due to its limited distribution throughout the state and risk from ongoing threats including clearing.

Nepean Region Ecological Vegetation Classes

This map is based on EVC maps of the modelled distribution of pre-1750 vegetation boundaries (NRE 2002). Less than 20% of native vegetation cover is remaining today within the Nepean region.

It is intended as a guide for determining the EVC in which you will be planting.
